To Act or not to Act. The Role of the Omission Bias in Moral Judgments

Abstract: It has been often argued, in particular within non-consequentialist ethics, that doing harm is worse than allowing harm. The corresponding moral intuition is thought to play a primary role in driving moral evaluations and responsibility attributions. The present paper discusses the nature of such an intuition as grounded in specific cognitive biases featuring in causal reasoning applied to omission cases.
